

Our first fundraising gala was held on October 23, 2010. We enjoyed local foods and wines, and raised over \$3,000 to start an endowed fund with the Community Foundation of Kingston and Area to support school gardening programs. With the match from the Board of Directors, and the donations expected through the Annual Giving Campaign, we aim to raise \$70,000 in 2011 to support our arts and environmental education programs.

Growing an Education

Under the caring tutelage of Faye Ginies, a Queen's University intern specializing in heritage gardens, we designed and planted a series of flower and vegetable gardens in the meadows surrounding Wintergreen. In addition to the perennial flower and herb gardens, we planted a Wartime Victory Garden featuring vegetables that produce a high yield in a small amount of space. A Three Sisters Garden, based on the Six Nations tradition of planting squash, beans, and corn as companion plants, was also planted. These gardens served as a focal point for visiting school groups throughout the early fall. The project culminated in a partnership with Earthworx, Compostec, and the Worm Factory. We were supported throughout the process by a local initiatives program grant from the Frontenac CFDC, one of several grants we received from the FCDC in 2010.
